Our Aquatics Department continues to grow, strengthen, and create meaningful opportunities for swimmers of all ages and abilities. This year, our competitive swim programs made a big splash — with the Gettysburg Sharks finishing the season undefeated and the Hanover Stingrays earning an impressive 3-1-1 record. We were also proud to welcome the New Oxford Swim Team, hosting their first-ever senior night and first home meet in 40 years — reminding us that the Y is truly a community anchor. Beyond competition, we focused on skill-building and confidence, teaching more than 450 swim lessons and expanding our program offerings with new Aqua Board Classes and Therasplash. Members also enjoyed signature traditions like our Underwater Easter Egg Hunt and Scuba with Santa, and we introduced a fun new event with our Doggy Dip. Together, these programs continue to strengthen skills, build confidence, and create joyful lifelong experiences through water.

At the Hanover Area YMCA, kids are able to enjoy an array of sports programs that range from swim team to basketball to gymnastics and so much more. We are fortunate to be able to offer instructional, recreational, and competitive options to accommodate the athletic level of each individual child.

Gymnastics lead its way through our Tim Weaver Battlefield Invitational, welcoming 1,374 participants to compete. With our team receiving 1st Place for Girls, Level 10, and 1st Place for Boys Level 5d2 and Level 8.

We had 6 teams, with 61 girls altogether, compete in our Hanover Volleyball Club. They brought home 17 golds and 14 silvers.

HANOVER AREA YMCA DOG PARK

Opening in 2025, the Hanover Area YMCA Dog Park represents an exciting new way to experience wellness, connection, and community. This 15,000 square-foot, fully enclosed space features synthetic turf, agility equipment, separate areas for large and small dogs, benches, shaded seating, a covered pavilion, and water stations—everything designed to support safe play, exercise, and social interaction. Open to both YMCA members and non-members, the park welcomes anyone looking to enjoy time outdoors while strengthening the bond between pets and their people.

Beyond the physical space, the dog park reflects the YMCA’s mission to foster belonging, healthy living, and community connection. It creates opportunities for friendships across generations, encourages movement and emotional well-being, and expands how people engage with the Y, not just as a place for fitness or programs, but as a trusted community anchor. This project shows how innovative ideas grounded in purpose can enrich lives and strengthen the fabric of our community in lasting and meaningful ways.

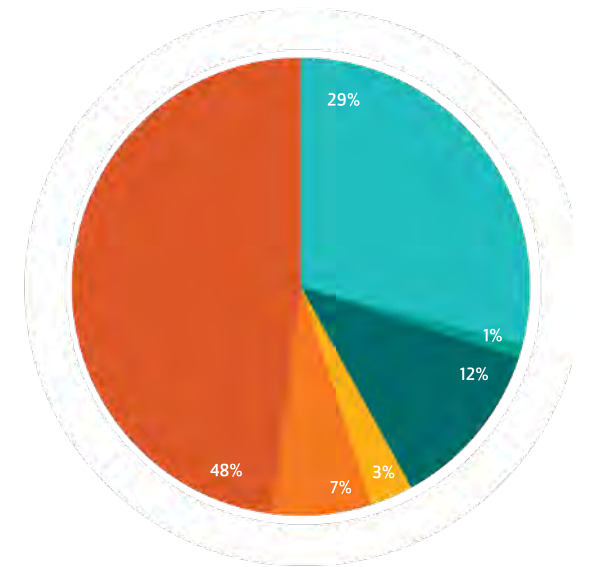
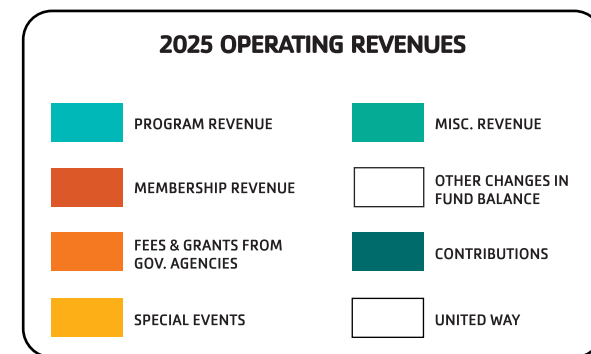


STAFF OF THE YEAR Marianne Edwards
